

Over the summer, three of our secondary students represented us in Singapore at the International Science Competition Global Round. We congratulate Nguyen Phuc Bao Khanh (Pearl) winning the Silver Award, Le Thai An achieving the Bronze Award, and Bui Dai Nam achieving the Bronze Award on their outstanding results. Their success stands as a reminder of what our students can achieve through perseverance and dedication.

Academically, we are pleased to share our provisional AS and A-Level results, while we await the final Cambridge World totals. These results show strong overall attainment, with nearly 90% of A-Level grades at C or above, particularly in Mathematics, Science, and Business, and with nearly three quarter of AS-Level grades at C and above. These achievements give us a clear baseline from which to continue building, with targeted support, exam skills coaching, and regular progress checks helping every student move forward with confidence.

Beyond the classroom, we look forward to the vibrancy of our clubs, extracurricular activities, and community events, beginning with our upcoming Opening Ceremony. These programs play a vital role in student life, offering opportunities to discover talents, connect with others, and develop confidence and leadership. - R is for Relationships remembering that friendships and kindness help us feel connected and supported.
- M is for Meaning knowing that what we do every day, in class and outside, has a purpose.
 - A is for Accomplishment celebrating our progress, whether it's reaching a big goal or simply improving a little each day.

At school, we believe that grades matter, but so does your happiness. That's why the school promises to create a safe, caring, and supportive place where you can explore your passions, build friendships, and feel proud of your achievements. 
