Recent Academic Milestone:

In September, our High School students completed their first major summative assessment of the year with the **Checkpoint 1 examinations.** These assessments mark the first major summative event of the school year. The results provide valuable insight into each student's current understanding of knowledge and skills. Teachers will use this diagnostic information to identify areas of topical mastery and set targeted revision goals. Students are also encouraged to take an active role in their own topical mastery diagnosis. By analyzing their Checkpoint 1 results, students can effectively plan their revision. They should focus on reviewing topics where they showed weaknesses, seek feedback from teachers to clarify any misunderstandings, and create a structured study plan to address these areas. This approach will help students proactive thoroughly for the upcoming checkpoints and the official CIE assessments.



The Cambridge Autumnal 2025 Examination Series will take place from 30 September to 13 November 2025. This is a significant time for our students. It is especially important for those resitting examinations to improve their results, and additional revision, teacher support, and mock examinations are underway. We commend all candidates for their commitment. resilience. determination as they prepare for these important assessments.







Key Information for the Exam Series Attendance During Term 1 Break (13-17 October): Students with exams during 13–17 October attend only their scheduled sessions.

Arrival Time: Students must arrive at least 30 minutes before the scheduled exam start time.

Uniform & Conduct: All candidates are required to wear the full school uniform and adhere strictly to school regulations and Cambridge International examination guidelines. This includes compliance with rules regarding permitted and prohibited items in the exam yenue.
