
## Updates from High School Deputy Principal Dear Parents,

Center from Hong Kong, in collaboration with the Tourism Authority of Thailand, organizes this exam every year. For students who are enthusiastic about mathematics in all grade levels—from kindergarten to high school—this is a helpful intellectual playground that foster and encourage young people's love of the subject, help them develop their critical thinking skills, and build bridges between different cultures. He was awarded the national gold prize and will represent Vietnamese students in Thailand in April at the International Math Competition. We wish him courage, self-assurance, and success!
